Interpreting these assessments without appropriate competency can lead to misuse, misdiagnosis, and inflated costs. These instruments are complicated, in that they are designed for comprehensive evaluation by qualified professionals (often licensed master's or doctoral-level clinical psychologist, or psychometrically trained psychiatrists). They are often employed in medical and legal settings, demand knowledge and rigorous adherence to psychometric standards, and require a deep understanding of both psychopathology and personality theories.
